Olivier Marichalar is Head of the Communication, Press, and Studies Department at the Communication Directorate of Campus France. He is a recognised expert in international mobility trends. He has authored numerous publications on student mobility. Olivier has a strong academic background with degrees in various fields from prestigious institutions including Sorbonne University, EHESS, and Ecole Normale Supérieure Paris-Saclay.



Erika Boak is the British Council EU Education Director. She has a strong track record in international and domestic education policy, having worked with the Department for Education, the UN, UNICEF, and UNESCO. Daniel Finch-Race is an Assistant Professor in Geography at the University of Bologna and a Marie Skłodowska-Curie Global Fellow. He serves on the editorial boards of Modern & Contemporary France and Storicamente. His solo work includes publications in Nineteenth-Century Contexts, Journal of Historical Geography, and The Professional Geographer. He has co-authored studies in journals like ACME and cultural geographies, and co-edited books such as French Ecocriticism and Italian Science Fiction and the Environmental Humanities.



Pulkit Ghoderao is a PhD student in Theoretical Physics at Imperial College London, specialising in the early universe. He has researched reheating (1 second post-creation) and phase transitions (before the first second). Currently, he studies gravitational waves from phase transitions. Pulkit enjoys sharing his research with non-specialists, such as through his blog post "The Universe as an Ice Cream."

Daniel A. Gordon is a Senior Lecturer in European History at Edge Hill University and a member of the *Acteurs et mouvements sociaux* research seminar at Sciences Po Paris. He studied at Oxford and Sussex Universities and was an Entente Cordiale Scholar at the Université de Nice. He has taught at the Université de Rouen and the Université de Oldenburg. Daniel authored Immigrants and Intellectuals: May '68 and the Rise of Anti-Racism in France and has published articles in various journals. His research focuses on the history of free public transport in French towns since the 1970s. He co-hosts the French Talk podcast for French A-Level students in the UK.



Crina Grosan is a Senior Lecturer at King's College London, specialising in Digital Health and Applied Technology Assessment. She co-leads the Digital Twins for Health Centre and serves as deputy chair of the Subject Advisory Board. An affiliate member of the King's Institute for AI, her research focuses on AI, optimisation, and data analytics in healthcare. Dr. Grosan develops methods for machine learning and data analysis, aiming to advance AI-driven health technologies and ensure fairness in healthcare.

Jason Robinson FIMMM holds a Professorial Chair in Materials Physics at the University of Cambridge, where he leads the Department of Materials Science & Metallurgy and directs the Quantum Materials & Devices Group. His research focuses on multifunctional materials and devices in spintronics, superconductivity, and quantum technologies. He has made significant contributions, including discovering triplet Cooper pairs and pioneering superconducting spintronics.



Ke Li is an Assistant Professor at the University of Nottingham, specialising in electrical energy conversion systems. He holds an MEng from Ecole Centrale de Marseille and a PhD from the University of Lille. His research aims to enhance efficiency, reliability, and intelligence in support of sustainable development and Net Zero goals. With over 50 published papers, he has led research projects worth over £1M and collaborates with French universities and industries.



Stephen Cowan has led the London Borough of Hammersmith & Fulham since 2014, achieving three landslide victories. He pioneered initiatives like free adult social care, free primary school breakfasts, and a STEM³ industrial strategy, attracting £6 billion in investment. Stephen co-founded the White City Innovation District in 2017 and launched the second chapter of the Upstream London industrial strategy in 2024. A municipal politician since 1998, he also volunteered on Barack Obama's 2007-2008 presidential campaigns.

Kourosh Francisco Shirazi is the co-founder of Bluco, an Al tool assisting recruiters on the filtering of candidates. After studying Management Sciences and Software Engineering at UCL, he pursued a degree at HEC Paris and Ecole Polytechnique. Based at STATION F, the start-up hub in Paris, Bluco has flourished and now operates in multiple European countries, including France, the UK, Italy, and Spain.

Ghida Ibrahim is VP of Product and Data at Sector Alarm. She previously spent over 5 years as Technical Manager at Meta, developing Al systems for Facebook, Instagram, and WhatsApp. Ghida has also worked with leading European telecom operators. She holds a PhD and an Engineering degree from Telecom ParisTech and advises on new technology trends for the World Economic Forum and other organisations.



Gregor Lenz is a deep-tech entrepreneur specialising in AI, robotics, and embedded systems. He holds a PhD from Sorbonne Université and has worked at Imperial College London and AI startups in Paris and Zurich. He co-founded Neurobus and Open Neuromorphic. His work earned 1st place at the European Defence Tech Hackathon. In 2025, he joined Paddington Robotics in London. Trilingual in German, English, and French, he advocates for stronger Franco-British innovation ties.



James Peach is COO of OutSee, an Al for genetic analysis start-up. He founded Genomics England and two other tech-bio companies. He chairs the BIA Data Access subcommittee and sits on several health data committees. An Entente Cordiale Scholar, he studied at Sciences Po Paris and worked in defence consulting. His career includes roles at McKinsey, Cancer Research UK, and Syncona VC. For the past decade, he has advised and mentored health data science companies and government initiatives.



Sandeep Sandhu leads strategic stakeholder engagement at Innovate UK Business Connect. She has cultivated partnerships with government, industry, and academia. Previously, she directed Innovate UK's international programmes and served as Senior International Policy Manager at UK Research & Innovation. At the Medical Research Council, she managed global health programmes. Sandeep holds a PhD in Biochemistry from the University of Birmingham.

Maddalaine Ansell joined the British Council as Director Education in November 2018. Prior to this she was Chief Executive of University Alliance. Maddalaine previously worked for 15 years as a Civil Servant with stints in the Treasury, Number 10, the Home Office and the then Department for Business, Innovation and Skills. She began her career as a corporate lawyer, working for both Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer and Sullivan & Cromwell. Maddalaine leads the Global Education Strategy and Portfolio working collaboratively with colleagues in British Council offices across the world and with HMG, the Devolved Administrations and the Higher Education Sector.

Sarah de Lagarde, Global Head of Corporate Affairs at Janus Henderson, is the epitome of resilience and hope. With over 20 years in communications and public relations, and advanced degrees from ESCP and Cornell, she excels in translating complex investment concepts into engaging narratives. After a near-fatal accident in 2022, she became the first woman to conquer Mount Kilimanjaro on two prosthetic limbs. As a pioneer in prosthetic technology and AI, she inspires audiences globally with her story of overcoming adversity. Her talks cover the transformative impact of AI in healthcare, showcasing her journey of thriving against all odds.

Aziz Kaouech, a proud Tunisian, left his home country in 2012 to study Financial Economics at EDHEC Business School in Nice and London. After earning his master's degree in 2018, he worked in technology and the fast-moving consumer goods industry in Paris and London. Aziz then founded Dooda, a startup that produces nutrient-rich protein powder from insects to promote climate-friendly food production and reduce food scarcity. Featured in the short film "Leader Generation," Aziz continues his journey with EDHEC, now leading research at the Centre for Net Positive Business to develop sustainable business models and assist businesses in transitioning to more sustainable operations.

Grace Vanstone-Hallam works in the International Group at HM Treasury. She obtained her undergradute degree in European Social and Political Studies from University College London with a year abroad at the Sorbonne University Paris IV. Since graduating, her career has spanned multiple Government departments and roles, including as Assistant Private Secretary to the Leader of the House of Commons, and a posting in Brussels at the UK Representation to the EU. She recently returned from a secondment to the Institut national du Service public where she completed a work placement at the Africa Directorate in the French Foreign Ministry and obtained a masters in Political Science from the University of the Sorbonne Panthéon.

Pierre-Clément Herbere-Desmier is currently Sales Account Manager at Google. He began his career with a degree in History at the Sorbonne, followed by a Masters in Business and European Affairs. He has navigated various European and African markets, previously working at Triptease, UnitedHealth Group and BlackBerry. In addition to his role at Google, Pierre-Clément is actively involved in Al for Good, running job re-entry masterclasses with Oreegami, training new generations in Al for interviews, and lecturing on the History of Al, with the aim of democratising access and promoting ethical use.
